Many counties in rural North Carolina do not have public transportation. And for many people, the cost of cars and gas is too expensive. Healthy Opportunities can help pay for a bus pass or ride shares. They can also tell you about local organizations who may offer rides for free. Transportation services help members feel more involved in their community. Members may get help for rides to locations such as grocery stores, job interviews, or parks.



Healthy Opportunities Pilot

The Healthy Opportunities Pilot Program provides help for those in need of housing, food, transportation, and interpersonal safety/toxic stress support. To ask about your eligibility or find out more, talk to your care manager or call Trillium and ask about the Healthy Opportunities Pilot Program at **1-877-685-2415**.

Note: This pilot program is only available in the following counties: Beaufort, Bertie, Bladen, Brunswick, Chowan, Columbus, Edgecombe, Halifax, Hertford, New Hanover, Martin, Onslow, Northampton, Pender, and Pitt.



Housing Services

Everyone needs a safe place to live so they can focus on their health. Housing services help improve health outcomes and reduce housing-related health risks, such as asthma, for members. Pilot Housing services include navigation and case management to identify housing needs, find appropriate housing, and develop housing support or a crisis plan, as needed.



Food Services

It is hard to focus on your health if you are not sure where you will find your next meal. Food services help members experiencing food insecurity to find and learn about healthy food options. Pilot Food services may include: assistance locating community-based food resources, vouchers to purchase food, and healthy food boxes.

Interpersonal Safety

Domestic violence can happen to anyone, and harms people physically, financially, and emotionally. Interpersonal safety services and activities help members experiencing violence, abuse and toxic stress. Interpersonal safety services and activities can help qualifying members be connected to legal supports, find a safe place to live, receive referrals to domestic violence shelters and parenting services, and develop safety plans. Care Managers work with members in a secure, private way to protect the identity of the member.
