CLINICAL COMMUNICATION UPDATE REGARDING NO PRIOR AUTHORIZATIONS

Effective February 1, 2025, NPA (no prior authorization) flexibility will end and all TARs, not subject to parity, will require a medical necessity review. Authorization requests will need to have all required documentation uploaded so please take time and review the benefit plans posted on Trillium's website at <u>Benefit Plans I Service Definitions I Trillium Health Resources</u>.

THE HUMAN RIGHTS COMMITTEE (HRC)

The Trillium Human Rights Committee (HRC) is dedicated to safeguarding the rights of individuals receiving mental health, substance use, and intellectual/developmental disability (I/DD) services. Working hand-in-hand with CFAC members, families, Trillium staff, and providers, the HRC ensures that services are always delivered with respect for member rights.

The HRC is a diverse group including family members, individuals served, practitioners, providers, and specialists representing all disability groups and regions in Trillium's catchment area. Participants must adhere to privacy and HIPAA laws and commit to attending all meetings. Trillium staff act as liaisons and provide administrative support to the committee, with regular reports made to the Quality Improvement Committee (QIC), which takes appropriate action based on the HRC's recommendations.

The HRC's mission, in accordance with NC General Statues/ Administrative Code is to ensure compliance with members' rights, confidentiality laws, and established procedures for handling grievances, allegations of abuse, and concerns about restrictive treatment and service access. The committee's primary responsibilities include reviewing:

- Critical incidents involving restrictive interventions, allegations of abuse, neglect, exploitation by staff, and member deaths.
- Complaints and grievances related to member rights violations, questionable practices, service access, inadequate treatment, confidentiality issues, alleged abuse, and unsafe facilities.
- Provider concerns related to quality of care, accessibility, health and safety, and crisis responsiveness.

To serve on the HRC, you must be an adult member/recipient, a relative or guardian of a member/recipient, a network provider, or other stakeholder living in one of the counties in Trillium's catchment area.

DMHDDSUS CELEBRATES TWO YEAR ANNIVERSARY OF BEHAVIORAL HEALTH STATEWIDE CENTRAL AVAILABILITY NAVIGATOR (BH SCAN)

This month marks two years since the Division of Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities and Substance Use Services (DMHDDSUS) launched <u>BH SCAN</u>, a platform designed to connect people to the right care at the right time in the right place. This technology includes a centralized bed registry for mental health and substance use care,

offering daily updates on available beds. The goal is to help providers make faster referrals and reduce long waits in emergency departments.

Since its launch, over 3,100 licensed beds have been enrolled, covering the following services:

- Community and state psychiatric inpatient facilities
- Psychiatric residential treatment facilities (PRTFs)
- Adult and youth facility-based crisis centers (FBCs)
- Substance use treatment centers

In 2024, we expanded this functionality to include 928 beds across 25 locations that provide **hourly, automated updates** on bed availability. Nearly 100 organizations now have real-time access to this data.

North Carolina has been a strong adopter of this technology, with 83% of facilities reporting bed availability in BH SCAN daily. This data helps providers find essential inpatient and crisis care for people more efficiently and offers critical insights to DMHDDSUS, including the identification of gaps in the statewide crisis system and highlighting areas where additional beds may be needed.

In 2023, we piloted **Automated Bed Availability (ABA)** with Bamboo Health and UNC. Looking ahead, we're preparing to launch **digital referral technology** in early 2025. This system will integrate ABA with providers' Electronic Health Record (EHR) systems, streamlining referrals between providers. Future updates will include mobile crisis dispatch integration, making referrals even more comprehensive.

BH SCAN is already making a difference. For example, during Hurricane Helene, the system helped providers quickly find available beds and transfer patients to operational facilities when others were closed.

DMHDDSUS remains committed to improving BH SCAN to meet the needs of North Carolinians—both providers and individuals—ensuring timely and effective care for all.

NORTH CAROLINA CHILD TREATMENT PROGRAM PARTNERING WITH LICENSED MENTAL HEALTH PROVIDERS

The North Carolina Child Treatment Program (NC CTP) is partnering with the NC Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) on the new <u>Safe Babies Court Initiative</u>. We're working in pilot counties to recruit licensed mental health professionals to become trained in Child-Parent Psychotherapy (CPP), a model designed to support children aged 0-6 and their caregivers. The Courts are covering the tuition for the training.

Two of the counties in the pilot-Brunswick and New Hanover are in your area, and I'm reaching out to see if you might be open to sharing our advertising about it with your providers. The courts are covering the cost of the tuition. We would greatly appreciate if you can share the links to help us reach clinicians and therapists in your community.

NEW MENTAL HEALTH PARITY AND ADDICTION EQUITY ACT WEBPAGE

There are federal laws like the <u>Mental Health Parity and Addiction Equity Act</u> of 2008 that Trillium must follow. This law requires health plans to treat behavioral health services the same as physical health services. Rules for mental health and substance use services must be like those for medical or surgical services. This includes limitations like copays, visit limits, and prior authorization requirements.

CLAIMS DENIAL FOR SERVICES WITH IDENTIFIED THIRD-PARTY INSURANCE

Updates to NCTracks Third Party Liability process for NC Medicaid Direct. This bulletin article applies to NC Medicaid Direct.

As part of NC Medicaid's commitment to ensuring compliance with federal regulations, we are implementing updates to NCTracks Third Party Liability (TPL) process for NC Medicaid Direct. These updates will impact claims submitted for certain services when a member has other third-party insurance coverage listed in their eligibility record.

WHAT THIS MEANS FOR PROVIDERS

A Claims for the following services will be **denied** if third-party insurance is detected in the member's eligibility record:

- Hospice
- Private Duty Nursing
- Home Infusion Therapy
- Local Health Department (LHD)
- Therapy Services
- Institutional Ambulance
- Hearing Aid
- Independent Diagnostic Testing Facility/Portable X-ray
- Providers are required to submit these claims to the member's primary insurer before billing Medicaid.

WHAT PROVIDERS NEED TO DO TO AVOID CLAIM DENIALS

- 1. Check Member Eligibility before Billing: Always verify member eligibility and third-party insurance information in NCTracks prior to submitting claims.
- Submit Claims to Primary Insurance First: Ensure claims for the affected services
 are submitted to any identified third-party insurance before sending them to NC
 Medicaid.
- **3. Maintain Documentation**: Keep Explanation of Benefits (EOB) records from the primary insurers for audit and resubmission purposes.

Claims submitted prior to Dec. 31, 2024, will not be affected. These updates align with NC Medicaid Direct federally mandated role as the payer of last resort.

OFFICE ADMINISTRATOR (OA) CHANGE TIPS

How to Answer the Continued Access Question in an OA Change Request

When completing an OA change request, users will see the question "Do you want the existing user to continue to have access to this NPI?" with answer choices of yes or no. This answer determines future access for NPIs previously associated with the OA.

ROADMAP2READY: FEBRUARY

Disaster plans must be submitted through the following link: 2025 Disaster Plan Submission.

To confirm your disaster plan was received just check the "send me a copy of my responses" option at the end of the Disaster Plan Submission form.

Disaster Plans are due *May 1, 2025*. Even if no updates are needed to your 2025 Disaster Plan, you *MUST* still resubmit the plan with a new cover page displaying the current year and disaster contact info. Failure to submit your Disaster Plan by the deadline (May 1, 2025), may result in an audit and/or plan of correction.

The U.S. <u>Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS)</u> posted guideline requirements for all entities that receive Medicaid funds and this applies to all of our Medicaid providers. For your reference, we have attached the <u>Final Rule</u> that will assist you in locating the requirements to the federal rules that apply to each of your situations.

Our contract with providers requires that you have adequate disaster planning and training process in place within your organization. We know that the best way to cope

when a disaster strikes is preparation. Please connect with your <u>local emergency</u> <u>management</u> office, know your local hazards and resources, and stay connected with Trillium in the event of an emergency. Trillium has posted a Request For Proposal (RFP) to invite service providers to submit a proposal for the implementation of Transition Management Services (TMS). Transition Management Services (TMS) is provided to individuals participating in the Transition to Community Living (TCL) initiative. TMS is a rehabilitation service intended to increase and restore an individual's ability to live successfully in the community by maintaining tenancy. TMS focuses on increasing the individual's ability to live as independently as possible, managing the illness, and reestablishing his or her community roles related to the following life domains: emotional, social, safety, housing, medical and health, educational, vocational, and legal. TMS provides structured rehabilitative interventions through a team approach. Providers may submit proposals for one or more of the counties/regions included in the RFP.

2024-2025 NATIONAL CORE INDICATORS-I/DD SURVEY

Trillium is partnering with NCDHHS to support the annual National Core Indicators (NCI) survey, which evaluates the outcomes of individuals receiving Intellectual and Developmental Disability (I/DD) services. This survey examines critical areas such as employment, community involvement, relationships, health and wellness, safety, and access to services. Standardized questions allow for comparisons between states and provide valuable insights into service quality.

How Providers Will Be Involved

Providers serving members with I/DD aged 18 and older may be contacted to assist in the following ways:

- Obtaining member consent for survey participation.
- Providing background information for consenting members.

Survey administration will be handled by the Carolina Institute for Developmental Disabilities (CIDD), a third-party organization contracted by the State.

The survey sample and a minimum number of surveys are provided by the State. Support may be requested from providers until the minimum participation requirement established by NCDHHS is met.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR SURVEY PARTICIPATION

Members must meet the following criteria to participate in the survey:

- Be diagnosed with an intellectual or developmental disability.
- Receive Medicaid-funded services from an I/DD provider agency.
- Be at least 18 years old.

TRILLIUM IS A CLOSED NETWORK FOR BH/SUD/IDD

As a reminder, Trillium operates a closed network for all behavioral health, substance use, and intellectual and developmental disabilities services. (*N.C. Gen. Stat. 108D-23*).

At this time, Trillium is <u>not accepting requests to add new providers</u> to the Trillium behavioral health, substance use, and intellectual and developmental disabilities provider network outside of a published recruitment opportunity.

Trillium continually assesses the needs of members and adjusts the network to ensure members have access to needed services. <u>Current service needs</u> are posted on our website. Non-contracted providers can submit an <u>Interest Submission Form</u> to express future interest in contracting for behavioral health, substance use, and intellectual/developmental disabilities services.

Trillium will review interest submissions on a monthly basis.
