# NORTH CAROLINA MEDICAID MANAGED CARE PROVIDER UPDATE

#### NC MEDICAID TEMPORARY FLEXIBILITIES DUE TO HURRICANE HELENE

NC Medicaid remains committed to North Carolina's response to and recovery from Hurricane Helene. We are working with county and federal partners to make it faster and easier for beneficiaries to receive (*and for healthcare professionals to provide*) Medicaid services.

The flexibilities outlined in the <u>Hurricane Helene Policy Flexibilities to Support Providers</u> <u>and Members - Dec. 12, 2024</u> bulletin are effective from Sept. 26, 2024, through the end of the Public Health Emergency on **Feb. 28, 2025**, unless otherwise communicated by the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services (NCDHHS).

As a reminder, providers should always check NC Medicaid eligibility in NCTracks to confirm beneficiary enrollment in NC Medicaid, especially when the beneficiary presents without a Medicaid ID or their health plan ID card, to determine which health plan the beneficiary is enrolled in and whether their eligibility remains current.

#### ORDERING, PRESCRIBING, OR REFERRING (OPR) PROVIDER UPDATES AVAILABLE

NC Medicaid published a new bulletin, <u>Federal Regulation Guidelines for Ordering</u>, <u>Prescribing or Referring Providers</u>, to provide guidance regarding enrollment requirements for OPR providers, as well as information regarding the requirement for ordering and referring NPIs to be included on claims. The information shared in this bulletin supersedes the September 2016 Medicaid Ordering, Prescribing or Referring (OPR) Special Bulletin. The 2016 OPR Special Bulletin should no longer be used as reference. The NCTracks Provider Portal is also updated.

#### EDUCATION TRANSCRIPTS NO LONGER REQUIRED FOR NORTH CAROLINA MEDICAL BOARD LICENSED PROVIDERS

As of Jan. 8, 2025, school education and training transcripts are no longer required for North Carolina Medical Board (NCMB) licensed providers. This change simplifies the process for providers and streamlines resources, while maintaining compliance with National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA) standards.

Currently, NCTracks requests that some providers submit their school transcripts as proof of the highest level of education listed on their application. NCMB's primary source

verification (PSV) process verifies education and training, eliminating the need to request transcripts.

A list of additional state license agencies that can be used by NCTracks as primary source verification of education and training is available on the NCTracks <u>Provider</u> <u>Supplemental Information FAOs</u> page under Resources.

#### **PROVIDER NATIONAL ACCREDITATION POST-ENROLLMENT REQUIREMENTS**

Refer to <u>Program Specific Clinical Coverage Policies</u> for additional requirements.

When the <u>Provider Permission Matrix (PPM)</u> displays a requirement for national accreditation for the taxonomy and/or service selected, the national accreditation is required prior to approval for participation with NC Medicaid under that taxonomy. In addition, some behavioral health services require national accreditation within one year or three years of the initial enrollment as an NC Medicaid provider.

Information about these post-enrollment national accreditation requirements is not currently available on the PPM. A review of the program specific clinical coverage policy is required. #### FEDERAL FEE INCREASE FOR CALENDAR YEAR 2025

Effective Jan. 1, 2025, the federal fee for Medicaid provider enrollment increased to \$730 and is required as noted on the <u>Provider Permission Matrix</u> for initial enrollment, re-enrollment, and reverification applications, as well as adding a new owner or a new site location.

#### **NOTIFICATION REQUIRED FOR CHANGE OF OWNERSHIP**

Consistent with State and federal law, NCDHHS requires notification of any change of ownership (CHOW) for providers enrolled as a NC Medicaid provider. The enrolled provider must notify the Department at least 30 days prior to the effective date of any CHOW.

Providers will need to complete the <u>Provider Change of Ownership Disclosure Form</u>. The form is located on the <u>NCTracks Providers webpage</u> under Quick Links.

Once the form is downloaded, the Provider will need to:

- 1. Complete all applicable fields within the CHOW form
- Email the form and any supporting documentation to <u>medicaid.chow.workgroup@dhhs.nc.gov</u>

In conjunction with submitting the Disclosure Form, both the seller and buyer must make changes to the NCTracks enrollment record as applicable to reflect the intended structure of the enrollment record under the buyer. # TRILLIUM PARTNERSHIP WITH CAROLINA INSTITUTE FOR DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES

Trillium has partnered with the Carolina Institute for Developmental Disabilities (CIDD) to employee Family Navigators to support the families of Trillium members receiving services and support from UNC-CIDD's clinics and pediatric outpatient services.

Trillium encourages Tailored Care Management and other providers to work collaboratively with CIDD as they support children and families in Family Navigation, and to join with CIDD to leverage this unique Family Navigator role, which does not replace the tailored care management role. Family Navigators partner with families, caregivers, and members to provide an array of formal and informal services and supports so that members can achieve their full potential and are able to live successfully in their community. Family Navigator services can be provided in individual or group settings, in person, by phone, or virtually. Importantly, Family Navigators are parents or care givers of loved ones with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) or traumatic brain injury (TBI) and bring that lived experience navigating systems and accessing resources.

The CIDD is a comprehensive center providing multidisciplinary clinical services, conducting basic to applied research, conducting clinical and research training and engaging in advocacy, all with the goal of improving the lives of individuals with developmental disabilities and their families throughout North Carolina and across the country.

Effective February 1, 2025, NPA (no prior authorization) flexibility will end and all TARs not subject to parity will require a medical necessity review. To confirm your disaster plan was received just check the "send me a copy of my responses" option at the end of the Disaster Plan Submission form.

Disaster Plans are due *May 1, 2025*. Even if no updates are needed to your 2025 Disaster Plan, you *MUST* still resubmit the plan with a new cover page displaying the current year and disaster contact info. Failure to submit your Disaster Plan by the deadline (May 1, 2025), may result in an audit and/or plan of correction.

The U.S. <u>Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS)</u> posted guideline requirements for all entities that receive Medicaid funds and this applies to all of our Medicaid providers. For your reference, we have attached the <u>Final Rule</u> that will assist you in locating the requirements to the federal rules that apply to each of your situations.

Our contract with providers requires that you have adequate disaster planning and training process in place within your organization. We know that the best way to cope when a disaster strike is preparation. Please connect with your local emergency <u>management</u> office, know your local hazards and resources, and stay connected with Trillium in the event of an emergency. ### TRILLIUM IS A CLOSED NETWORK FOR BH/SUD/IDD

As a reminder, Trillium operates a closed network for all behavioral health, substance use, and intellectual and developmental disabilities services. (*N.C. Gen. Stat. 108D-23*).

At this time, Trillium is <u>not accepting requests to add new providers</u> to the Trillium behavioral health, substance use, and intellectual and developmental disabilities provider network outside of a published recruitment opportunity.

Trillium continually assesses the needs of members and adjusts the network to ensure members have access to needed services. <u>Current service needs</u> are posted on our website. Non-contracted providers can submit an <u>Interest Submission Form</u> to express future interest in contracting for behavioral health, substance use, and intellectual/developmental disabilities services.

Trillium will review interest submissions on a monthly basis.
