VIII. Regional Vice President Report	Ms. Victoria Jackson provided updates on Tailored Plan, School-Based Therapy Services, Local Community activities, and SB425 Legislation.	
	Tailored Plan Update Trillium launched the Behavioral Health I/DD Tailored Plan on July 1, 2024. The Tailored Plans continue to manage services to meet the behavioral health and intellectual/developmental disability needs of members but with the added management of physical health services, pharmacy benefits, non-emergency medical transportation (NEMT)and other benefits for members. All areas are tracking well. Call volumes for our Member and Recipient Service Line, and NEMT remain a key focus area. School-Based Therapy Services Update	
	Ms. Jackson provided an update on the Request for Information (RFI) for School-Based Therapy Services that Trillium published on April 17, 2024. Sampson County, Clinton City Schools currently has school-based therapy with the Project Activate grant program. The team met with the superintendent of Clinton City Schools where they provided additional school-based therapy resources. They also discussed expansion possibilities with their current program.	
	The team will continue to reach out to the other school districts in Sampson County to inquire about school-based therapy.	
	Ms. Jackson reported that every county within the South Central Region has school-based therapy available for students.	
	Ms. Sanders led the discussion about obtaining statistics on how many children are being served through school-based therapy per county. Commissioner Aycock suggested Dr. Whichard, Wayne County Schools Superintendent as a valuable resource for Wayne County.	
	Local Community Update Ms. Jackson stated that all nine annual presentations to the County Commissioners within the South Central Region have been completed.	

Participation in local community meetings continues through the Regional Vice President, Director of Community Engagement and Empowerment, and the Community Liaison Coordinators. For the month of September, approximately 110 engagements were completed within the South Central region.

Trillium will host a Community Simulation on January 9, 2025 in Wayne County. The event gives participants an opportunity to navigate the challenges families experience supporting children with disabilities.

The i2i Winter Conference is scheduled for December 11-12, 2024. Trillium will be hosting a Pre-Conference Session on December 9, 2024.

Ms. Jackson provided an update on the impact Hurricane Helene had on Trillium being able to provide support to the Western part of the state, and to members in residential treatment. Trillium's Care Management team reached out to approximately 295 members in the more heavily impacted counties. The team stayed in constant contact with the LME/MCOs directly impacted by the hurricane and they also gathered supplies and funding to support those impacted by the hurricane. The Provider Network team collaborated with providers to learn what their needs were and how to best support them.

Ms. Jackson expressed her appreciation to Commissioner Dowe for his support during the recent NC Field event in Duplin County. The team volunteered at the event to provide food and information on health care.

On November 20th, the team will present funding for an all-inclusive playground in Wallace, Duplin County.

SB425 Legislation Update

The alternative Trillium Governing Board structure and his appointment of the initial board members is still pending Secretary Kody Kinsley's approval.
